WHO: Adults, age 18-80 with **ASIA A-D** cervical (C1-C7) injury. To

participate, you must be at least two months out from a traumatic

SCI, be in satisfactory general health.

Structural and functional magnetic resonance imaging of the brain WHAT:

> and spinal cord. We will ask you to lie still in the MRI machine while we take pictures of your brain and spinal cord. The scan last

for 1 hour, we could ask you back for another MRI scan.

**RISKS:** The effects of magnetic fields in a MRI scanner have been

extensively studied, and there are no known significant risks.

**BENEFITS:** There is no direct benefit to you from participating in this study.

> Results from this study may benefit others in the future by improving the methods for studying the injured spinal cord.
